

MEMORIALS

Staff, students, and community members respond to the loss of a loved one or the departure of a person at times by wanting to use various sites on the school property and within school buildings for memorial purposes. While memorials are fine tributes to the memory of people who have made significant contributions to the school, district, and community, it is essential to monitor the use of grounds and buildings, the types of memorial being erected or adhered to surfaces, the safety and feasibility of objects in specific places, and the long-term effects on the district and its personnel.

Prior to providing any memorial on campus, the donors and/or groups of donors need to meet with the superintendent to explain the reasons for the memorial and the specific types of memorial the person(s) or group(s) has in mind. A minimum of six months' time period is required from the first meeting with the superintendent before an idea may be submitted to the board for approval. Upon request the superintendent will provide individuals or groups seeking to have memorials on campus with specific information about memorials on campus. The school district will not accept responsibility for the cost or upkeep of memorials, nor will the district be responsible for vandalism related to memorials. Memorials that are not appropriately maintained by the individuals or groups that initially provide them may be removed or reassigned to other individuals or groups who will maintain them.
